GNWPCD Teaches Local Students about Wastewater Treatment

Great Neck Water Pollution Control District Welcomes Great Neck South High School

The Great Neck Water Pollution Control District recently welcomed students from Great Neck South High School for a tour of the District's facility at 236 E Shore Road. The visit provided students insight into one of the most environmentally conscious wastewater treatment facilities in the northeast region.

The students from two of Holly Cipriano's AP environmental science classes toured the treatment center and viewed the state-of-the-art infrastructure as a model of sustainability for the future. Prior to the tour, students listened to a presentation and asked questions about the ongoing ecofriendly projects, the ultraviolet disinfection system, anaerobic digesters, microturbine systems, water conservation initiatives and the history of wastewater treatment.

The District provides tours throughout the school year to enhance local students' curriculum on sustainability and wastewater treatment—preparing them for future examinations including the AP environmental science exam in May.
