Jerry Landsberg Reelected As Great Neck Water Pollution Control District Commissioner

Great Neck, N.Y. (January 2, 2020)—The Great Neck Water Pollution Control District (GNWPCD) is proud to announce Commissioner Jerry Landsberg has been reelected and was recently sworn in as Commissioner. Landsberg’s victory provides an additional three years of service on the Board of Commissioners, which also comprises Steve Reiter and Patty Katz, to oversee all of the GNWPCD’s day-to-day operations.

“I am truly honored to receive all of this support from the Great Neck community,” said Commissioner Jerry Landsberg. “I am very excited to continue to serve the District and provide the best possible services to our valued residents.”

Jerry Landsberg will now serve for his fifth full term as Commissioner for the GNWPCD. He has spearheaded numerous initiatives and technology advancements, which included securing two \$50,000 grants to allow District headquarters to become ADA compliant. Landsberg is also a strong advocate for environmentally friendly and cost-effective projects, like the new microturbine co-generation facility project which came in a quarter of a million dollars (26%) under budget to fully satisfy the GNWPCD plant’s heating requirements.

The Great Neck Water Pollution Control District (GNWPCD) is a commissioner-run Special Improvement District within the Town of North Hempstead. The GNWPCD has provided sewage services for the Great Neck area since 1914, and currently serves more than 25,000 residents and businesses in the villages of Great Neck, Saddle Rock, Kensington, and those parts of Thomaston and Great Neck Plaza east of Middle Neck Road; as well as all unincorporated areas north of the Long Island Rail Road and a part of Manhasset.
